Title: Two Divinely Inspired Songs

Series: Revelation ... 21

Text: Revelation 15

Purpose: I want to INFORM my congregation that we have songs to sing that the world and angels cannot sing!

Introduction:

~ In Revelation 12 – 13 we are introduced to the dragon – Satan, the first beast – THE antichrist, and the second beast – THE false prophet; and chapter 14 gives us previews of the coming events recorded in chapters 16 – 18.

~ vs. 1 – seven angels prepare to pour out on EARTH the last judgments of God’s wrath.

~ vs. 2 – scene of the victors over the beast rejoicing with the songs (harps).

~ vs. 3 – they are singing two songs: the song of Moses and the song of the Lamb.

~ vs. 4 – prophetic of the global worship that is coming at the return of Christ Jesus.

~ vs. 5 – the tent of the witness in heave is opened.

~ vs. 6 – seven angels with the seven plagues exit the tent of the witness.

~ vs. 7 – they are given golden bowls full of the wrath of God who lives forever and ever.

~ vs. 8 – smoke from the glory of God filled the tent; there will be no intervention to God’s wrath.
